CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- He noted that the South Saskatchewan Regional Plan (SSRP) has now been approved. This plan is important because the basin borders the Red Deer River Basin and it would be expected that the forthcoming regional plan will contain much of the same direction. This plan is similar to others already approved, focussing on air and surface water quality, a commitment to develop a bio-diversity framework and also expands conservation areas within provincial crown land. It also calls for the development of a regional trail system and also addresses climate variability and flood and drought management practices that accompany these weather extremes.
- Ross noted that the benefit costs through Sun Life Financial decreased for the coming year, by approximately 3.4%.
- He thanked all staff and Council members that participated in planning, decorating and riding or walking in the Delia 100th Celebration Parade.
- He met with Tony Chelick from Alberta Transportation with regards to a number of local highway issues. The most significant of the issues was ongoing erosion at the Horse Thief Canyon

viewpoint. This site is maintained by Starland County, however, it is actually owned by Alberta Transportation who agreed to install an asphalt curb that will keep water away from the north side of the access road, which should minimize future erosion. They also looked at the erosion on the Bleriot Ferry Hill, noting the severe damage to the north side of SH838 going down the hill.

- The Alberta Emergency Management Agency just released Alberta's Plan for any Pandemic Influenza that might affect the Province.
- OH&S recently inspected facilities at the Public Works Yard and recommended that we take steps to improve the lighting in our cold storage shed. Cascade has been contracted to install four new T-5 electric start light fixtures as well as exit lights on the smaller exit doors.
- 911 emergency call centres will soon start receiving funds collected through a cell phone levy implemented earlier this year.
- WCB noted that the rate of Alberta workers being hurt on the job dropped in 2013 and is now at an all-time recorded low of 1.34 per 100 person-years. Despite the low claim rates, there were still 188 workplace fatalities in 2013.
- The Alberta Utilities Commission will be holding a hearing to review the application and submissions received for the wind power application from Suncor Energy Products Inc. An information session will be held on August 19th at the Cretaceous Conference Centre and a formal hearing will be held at the Badlands Community Facility on November 4th, 2014, commencing at 9:00 a.m.
- The Craigmyle Colony purchased the old Village of Morrin Fire Truck. They plan to upgrade the truck and make it available in a support role for fires in the Craigmyle and Delia areas.
- Ross ordered a new barbeque from Nortruck Manufacturing.
- Our safety audit for our Certificate of Recognition (COR) will be held during the week of August 18th.

- Crews have been installing culverts and widening some approaches.

- The crew worked on the chain link fence at the Craigmyle Playground.
- Graders have been blading back roads.
- Shale was hauled to the Delia Cemetery as per Glen's request.
- Thomas and Kevin are now doing the regular daily maintenance on the road crew equipment.
- 70 miles of the gravel program have been completed as well as 21 miles of add-ons.
- Several dust control spots have been completed.

Stantec noted that Bridgemen Services Ltd. met the contractual requirements at the bid stage and recommend that they be awarded the contract.

- No out of Hamlet garbage will be permitted;
- Used oil (only in closed labelled containers);
- Used antifreeze (only in closed labelled containers);
- No items accepted over 7 feet long (2.13m) maximum length;
- No farm chemicals or hazardous chemicals (must be disposed of at toxic waste roundup);
- Maximum weight of 50 pounds (22.6 kg).

Municipal Services
Report

At 2:43 p.m., Glen Riep, Manager of Municipal Services, attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- The installation of the new gazebo in Craigmyle is now complete. They placed the left over sod from the Delia Cemetery Project around the structure.
- The irrigation system has been completed for the park area which allows them to water the trees daily and will be used to water the grassed areas of the site.
- Approximately 35% of the trees planted earlier this year have died. Glen will be replacing them with new trees with a better root base.
- A number of power related problems were experienced in Craigmyle last week. With all the power surges and other interference issues, the duty pump was damaged and will need to be replaced. This pump supplies water to the residents.
- In order to prevent complete failure of the lift station again, Glen secured a rental pump that has now been installed into the existing station.
- The road to the Craigmyle sewage lagoon became impassable with heavier equipment due to the erosion of the base of the road. Jason has been working at building up the road with pit run material to ensure access to the lagoon.
- The new 3-phase power line has now been installed along the north side of our property feeding the new lift station. The trees along the north boundary of the property required removal for the

new line and the old barn onsite will also need to be removed before they will be able to activate this line.

- The main delay in this project is the delivery and installation of the building to house the genset and control panel. Hopefully it will be completed by the end of September or early October.
- The Annual Fire Appreciation BBQ was well attended and deemed a success. An inter-municipal training session is scheduled for this Thursday in Munson.
- Crews worked hard to get the Delia cemetery ready for their Centennial event.
- Crews have resumed mowing at the cemeteries and recreation areas once again due to all the rainfall. They also have been doing some contract mowing of some properties in the hamlets that have become unsightly.
- The Ryan Savory Annual Fishing Derby is scheduled for August 23, 2014 at the Michichi Dam. This Derby has been running for the past 20 years, however, this will be the last year for this event.
- Glen received an updated project estimation from Westcan Wireless regarding the Phase I system upgrade. He reviewed the proposal and confirmed to proceed with the proposal as outlined.
- Ebola break out has caused several provincial agencies to issue warning notices to municipalities regarding the risk to First Responders and other personnel that could become in contact with the virus. The risk is considered low and is transmitted by contaminated body fluids mainly. PPE is recommended as primary defence.
- The 2014 WCW Annual Conference & Exhibition is being held in Regina, Saskatchewan from September 23rd to 26th, 2014.
- The 2014 Alberta Development Officers Association Conference is being held in Canmore, Alberta from September 28th to October 1st, 2014.

Brownlee LLP re: SAEWA

They noted that they were retained by the Southern Alberta Energy From Waste Association (SAEWA) to prepare a report on the optimum Regional Governance Model that best suits the needs of SAEWA and its members. NRC re: Mandatory Reporting Standards for the Extractive Sector

This report outlines all the details involved with reporting required from extractive companies, both public as well as medium and large private companies, with a reporting threshold of \$100,000.00.


