

STARLAND COUNTY PUBLIC HEARING, SEPTEMBER 10th, 2025

RE: Proposed Bylaw 2013 for the purpose of establishing an alternative method for advertising statutory notices

A Public Hearing was held pursuant to Section 692 (1)(f) of the Municipal Government Act and the proposed Bylaw 2013 – Advertisement Bylaw, was held in the Starland County Administration Office in Morrin, Alberta, on Wednesday, September 10th, 2025, commencing at 9:09 AM.

The meeting was called to order by Reeve Wannstrom. Introductions were made.

Christopher Robblee presented the Staff Report about the proposed Bylaw 2013.

Notice of the Public Hearing was advertised in the August 27th, 2025, and the September 3rd, 2025, editions of the Drumheller Mail. Notice was also posted on the Starland County website and Facebook page. The proposed bylaw was made available on the County website, and printed copies were made available at the office.

Section 216.4(4) of the Municipal Government Act provides that the Council must hear:

- (1) must hear any person, group of persons or person representing them who claims to be affected by the proposed bylaw or resolution and who has complied with the procedures outlined by the council, and
- (2) may hear any other person who wishes to make representations and who the council agrees to hear.

After considering the representations made to them about the proposed bylaw at this public hearing, and after considering any other matter it considers appropriate, the Council in accordance with Section 216.4(5) of the Municipal Government Act may:

- (1) pass the proposed bylaw
- (2) Make any amendment to the bylaw it considers necessary and proceed to pass it without further advertisement or hearings, or
- (3) Defeat the bylaw

A summary of the information presented at this public hearing will be maintained in the form of minutes, and copies of all submissions received will be made available to all in attendance.

Chief Administrative Officer Robblee noted that he received no written submissions.

Chairman Wannstrom then asked for presentations from those who wished to speak either for or against the proposed bylaw. Each member of the public was asked to state their name, and whether they were speaking for or against the bylaw before beginning.

Sylvia Neil spoke in opposition of the proposed bylaw.


Carol Lenfesty spoke in opposition of the proposed bylaw.
