CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- The Province has now directed that the two North-South transmission lines proceed as recommended by the independent committee that was struck to review the issue. This will clear the way for generation projects such as the Hand Hills wind farm;
- On February 15th the new building received safety codes clearance though there are still some minor issues to be resolved. The April 20th grand opening may need to be postponed;
- The 2011 Audit by Endeavor Accountants is scheduled for the first week of April;
- On February 23rd we hosted a delegation from SAIT and toured all the solar development in the County;
- He attended the ARMAA zone meeting on February 24th where Gary Sandberg presented on Municipal Affairs future plans;
- He got an update on the Handhills Wind Farm Project,

- submissions from the public have been received by the AUC and will have to be addressed;
- The Province has introduced legislation to establish a Property Rights Advocate to strengthen land owner interests;
- Preparation is beginning for a municipal census sometime later this year.

PW Report

At 10:05 Acting Public Works Supervisor Pratt attended the meeting and presented his Public Works Report. Highlights of the report include the following:

- The Public Works crew has been busy with a variety of projects including moving FCSS staff into the new building:
- Mechanics have been working on Loader 821;
- Gradermen have been maintaining their divisions and doing some plowing when required;
- He would like to begin auctioning equipment in April;
- Stantec has updated their tender proposal for Bridge File 13425 which is ready to be posted on the APC website;
- He is proposing several changes to the road crew including an overall downsizing of staff numbers and additional equipment sharing between the road crew and public works.

CAO Rawlusyk presented the Municipal Services Report prepared by Manager of Municipal Services Riep. Highlights of the report include the following:

- He has been working on the annual water reports for each of the County systems. The report is a breakdown of all the daily log reports for each system detailing daily, weekly and monthly statistics for the flow variations;
- A Fire Newsletter for all members was sent out;
- The recent moisture has resulted in a lot of demand for burning permits to take advantage of the good conditions for burning;
- He will be meeting with the local Fire Chiefs on the development of the new Fire Protection Master Plan. A draft should be ready for next year;
- Verbal approval was given to the Rowley Grazing Association to do some mowing and brushing within the grazing lease.

AAMDC Spring Convention

Council was given the schedule for the 2012 AAMDC Spring Convention and CAO Rawlusyk reviewed the proposed resolutions.

Council was presented with a copy of the diversion license No. 14499 turned over to Starland County by Ducks Unlimited for the dam site on the SW-17-31-19-W4.

Administration Building Construction

CAO Rawlusyk reviewed the list of deficiencies compiled by Sherri Turpin during the February 15th inspection.

Community Futures Offer of Services

A proposal was received from Community Futures Big Country for economic development services. The proposal was for 20 hours a week of work from an economic development officer plus all administrative and management overhead for \$3,000 a month. This contract would be used to drive forward the initiatives outlined in the Starland Region Economic Development Plan as well as service the needs of the Starland Region Economic Development Committee.
