CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlусyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Ross noted that the transfer of tax recovery properties from the Province to Starland County is now complete. 1,248.97 acres were transferred to the County under this program. CAO Rawlусyk suggested that we should look at some form of sale process to generate some much needed revenues. He noted that we have a number of lease holders that have operated these lands for many years, so he suggested that we have an information meeting in early March to discuss the transition with them.
- The Provincial Electoral Boundaries Commission was appointed on October 31, 2016, commencing their work to review the boundaries and names of the 98 electoral constituencies in Alberta. Public Hearings will be held throughout the province during January and February, with a hearing to be held in Drumheller on January 24<sup>th</sup>, 2017 at 1:00 p.m.
- The Village of Delia is investigating the option of increasing the number of Councillors from 3 to 5 for this years election.
- The tender documents will be issued for the Morrin Bridge replacement within the next two months.
- The province has set up a carbon levy rebate to offset the carbon tax. The Government of Alberta hired the Canadian Revenue Agency (CRA) to administer the program, which is triggered by submitting your income tax return.
- The Province recently made an announcement for the *Not for Profit* sector. These organizations can save money and reduce greenhouse gas emissions by determining areas for energy efficiency improvements by performing an energy audit on their

facility.

- The Province has passed legislation that eliminates door to door energy marketers. This restriction applies to furnaces, natural gas and electricity energy contracts, water heaters, windows, air conditioners and energy audits.
- The Town of Hanna has asked for assistance in providing a Subdivision and Development Appeal Board. Ross arranged for a Board to hear their appeal which will be held in Hanna at PRMS Office on Friday, January 20<sup>th</sup>, 2017.
- Canada is celebrating its 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year. February 15<sup>th</sup> is National Flag of Canada Day.

Report

At 11:40 a.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- His crew have been busy with chlorinator repairs, inventory, grave preparation and internments, daily water system monitoring and testing as well as bacteriological sampling.
- They have also been organizing their parts storage in preparation for the inventory collection.
- Glen has discussed several water projects with MPE Engineering that he hopes to complete over the next year, including CLV water

transmission line feeding out of Drumheller, the supply to the Starland truckfill and fire hall at Munson, and some rural water service connections on the Starland Rural System.

- Morning Glory identified a small leak on their water system and requested the County's assistance with the repairs.
- Glen has been working with BRZ and Jubilee Engineering Consultants Inc. on some of the water services to the new fire hall.
- Rumsey water station upgrades are ongoing. Due to the building size limitations, much of the new apparatus and electrical panel upgrades will require the equipment to be located on the outside of the building.
- The final financial report and forms for the Alberta Fire Services and Emergency Preparedness Program Grant have been submitted. Under this program they were able to host 5 training courses with approximately 50 participants in total. There may be a similar program available later this year which Glen plans to apply for once again.

PRMS re: New Safety Code Fees

Correspondence was received from Palliser Regional Municipal Services advising that the Safety Code Fees administered by PRMS will be changing effective January 1, 2017. The new fee schedule was distributed for Council's review.

A summary of the 2016 Councillor salary pay calculations was distributed to Council for their review.

CPI re: 2017 Cost of Living Allowance

CAO Rawlusyk reviewed the Consumer Price Index, by province, for Alberta from November 2015 to November 2016. The CPI indicates 0.2 %. However, the memorandum of agreement with the employees indicates an increase of no lower than 1.5% or no higher than 4.5%. Therefore, employees will receive a cost of living allowance for 2017 of 1.5%, effective January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2017.

Management Review Recommendations & Implementation

Chief Administrative Officer Rawlusyk discussed items in regards to the management review recommendations implementation issues. Overall, 14 recommendations were made. Some of these recommendations have already been implemented and the other items will be implemented in the near future. Affected job descriptions have been revised and were also reviewed with Council.
