Council noted that in a recent census conducted within Starland County, only 190 residents indicated that they utilize medical services in Hanna, which is significantly less than the numbers used by the Hanna Medical Society of approximately 700. Public Works Report Public Works Supervisor Pratt reviewed his Public Works Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Personnel received training on ground disturbance as well as backhoe and skid steer operation;
- Ongoing pot-hole patching and crackfilling work;
- · Cleaned out two beaver dams;
- Regular maintenance items including culvert installations, dust control, building approaches and working on slide areas.
- Installed Michichi street signs, LSD signs and regulatory signs.
- The Road Crew have now started on the Hill Road. They also installed two culverts in the coulee on the Sand road as well as ripping and discing a half mile on Rng. Rd. 21-0.
- Rental equipment is lined up for Gartley road patching;
- Al has looked into purchasing a new flail mower and tractor to be used for road-side mowing;
- The AAMDC advised that there is a grader tire sale on now until July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2013. Al noted that the County could use 12 Sno-Plus tires and 6 rib tires. If purchased, this would be approximately \$12,000.00 in savings.

#### CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- The Province announced a set of new policies with regards to the flood victims, that will help landowners to decide if they want to rebuild or not. Under this policy, for homes located within a floodway, there will be funding available through the Disaster Recovery program to rebuild or relocate. There is also extra money available for flood mitigation for homeowners in a fringe area (things like berms, water control structures or raising a house). Homeowners in a flood fringe who do not implement mitigation measures to protect against a 1-in-100 flood event will not be eligible for Disaster Recovery. Homes and businesses in the flood-ways, and those who utilize Provincial Disaster Recovery funds will have a notice placed on their land title to ensure that future owners will be informed of the risk.
- Residents that migrated to Bow Valley Power and other Green Energy providers were advised last week that the 15¢ micro generator credit has been discontinued. Removal of this credit presents a real blow to the County's rural solar project and we have had some discussion on how we can protest the decision.
- Council and Staff photos are scheduled for the August 27<sup>th</sup>, 2013
   Council Meeting.
- The CLV tenders will be opened at today's meeting. A pre-tender discussion and information session was held on July 16<sup>th</sup>. The utility right-of-way agreements are now all in place and we are still waiting for the connection deposit from two of the new connections.
- The Starland County ASB Tour will be held on Wednesday, August 7<sup>th</sup>, leaving at 1:00 p.m. Registration will be held at the Michichi Dam Campground starting at 12:30 p.m. The cost of the

tour is \$20.00 and includes transportation, refreshments and a BBQ steak dinner.

- The Alberta Rural Municipal Administrators Association have chosen Drumheller as the host of the 2014 ARMAA Annual Conference, to be held on September 3<sup>rd</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup>, 2014.
- The Central Zone CAAMDC Director's meeting will be held in Three Hills on Friday, August 9<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 a.m.
- Ross met with Tim Schowalter, representing the Delia and District Historical Society to discuss the installation of interpretive signs in the Hand Hills. The signs would reference geological features that are of significance to the area.
- All applications and required forms for the MSI Operating and Capital Programs, Federal Gas Tax Fund and the Basic Municipal Transportation Grant programs have now been submitted.

Attendance of Diana Rowe re: FRW Program

At 1:10 p.m., Community Services Coordinator, Diana Rowe, attended the meeting to discuss the proposal put forth by Prairie Land Regional Division #25 to discuss upgrading the Family Resource Worker Program services in the Morrin and Delia Schools, as well as in the community. Diana provided statistical information with regards to the caseload in the past year and Student Health Initiative Program Student and Staff Surveys. CAO Rawlusyk noted that he feels a needs assessment of this program should be conducted. However, as this will take some time, he recommended that we hire an additional FRW worker on a one year term contract, with equal contributions from PLRD and Starland County to cover all expenses incurred.

They are requesting financial support of \$5,000.00. In addition, they are still seeking volunteers for this event and have requested that we find at least 30 volunteers for the portion of the tour which travels through Starland County. It was felt that we should be able to find 30 volunteers to assist with road blocks and traffic detours.

Municipal Services Report Manager Riep presented his Municipal Services Report to Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

 Gino and Glen attended a meeting with all the water users within the Drumheller Regional Water supply. They meet annually to discuss any issues within the regional systems associated with Drumheller and information on what Drumheller is doing with respect to enhancing the existing water quality.

- Power issues at the CLV water station continue to be an issue.
   The fluctuating power causes a number of alarms and failure to the monitoring system. He has met with Atco Electric, MPE and the electricians to try and resolve some of the disruptions.
- The Recreation crew has been very busy keeping up with the mowing program in the cemeteries, recreation sites and county properties across the municipality. In addition, two ball tournaments were held this past weekend, one in Rumsey and one at the Starland Recreation Area. Substantial preparations for these events were required to get these areas ready for use.
- There have been several applications for private access and approach developments in the past month, with many being the widening of existing approaches. This is due mostly to the increasing dimensions of the new farm equipment and grain trucks hauling in and out of properties.
- In regards to the fire and emergency services communication system upgrades, Westcan Wireless submitted a proposal for a review of all aspects of our present system. They will review same and draft recommendations on what improvements are necessary to make the system more accessible and dependable.
- The Annual Firemen's Appreciation BBQ will be held Thursday, July 25<sup>th</sup>, 2013 at the Starland Recreation Area, commencing at 5:30 p.m.

Council Communications

CAO Rawlusyk reviewed a Letter of Support prepared for the Craigmyle Historic Society's application for funding to upgrade and improve their facility. In addition, an *Approval for Intervention to a Municipal Historic Resource* is required for approving changes to designated Municipal Historic Resources. Written approval of the local municipal council must be obtained to safeguard the heritage values of all historical properties.

Correspondence was received from Stantec Consulting Ltd. with regards to the Norlie Road Improvement Wetland Assessment. They noted that it is likely that AESRD will require compensation. In addition, once Water Act approvals have been obtained, other regulatory requirements such as the Wildlife Act and Canada Migratory Bird Act will need to be satisfied prior to development. Under the Acts a breeding bird survey will need to be conducted prior to tree clearing and construction to determine the presence or absence of nesting and breeding bird activity.

A second quarter detailed financial report for Starland County was presented to Council for their review.

Correspondence was received from the AAMDC with regards to the "Funding Options for Law Enforcement Framework Services in Alberta" report. This report analyses six different funding models and identifies how they could potentially impact all municipalities. It identified no real, compelling reason for changing the existing funding and cost allocation model, therefore the AAMDC Board supports the status quo as presented in the report.

Council further discussed the request received from the Town of Drumheller for financial assistance for the *Tour of Alberta*.
