CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- He recently attended the 2013 FCM Annual Conference in Vancouver from May 30th to June 3rd. The sessions were all held in Canada Place. There were several interesting sessions, however, he felt the most important presentation was that of Denis Lebel, the Federal Minister of Transport, Infrastructure and Communications, who advised that the Federal Government will have the new Infrastructure Program ready for applications and promised that funding will be available for April of 2014. The Keynote address at the conference was from the Man in Motion, Rick Hansen, who was outstanding.
- The Summer Fun Program will begin on Tuesday, July 2nd and run through to August 21st. It will operate on Monday and Tuesday in Delia and in Morrin on Wednesday and Thursday. Kaci and Karissa Reid are presently planning and coordinating the activities for this program.
- The Starland County Summer Picnic and employee and councillor long service awards presentations will be held in Rowley on Friday, July 19th.
- Ross attended the Emerald Awards presentation on June 6th.

STARLAND COUNTY

These awards are given to individuals or organizations that work to recognize, celebrate and inspire environmental excellence in Alberta. A record 123 nominations were received this year and he was proud to advise that he was nominated and made the cut to be one of 32 finalists for this recognition.

- On June 3rd, the CRTC issued a new wireless code that will make it easier for Canadians to understand their cell phone contracts. The new code allows users to terminate their wireless contract after 2 years without cancellation fees, even if they have signed on for a longer term; it caps extra data charges at \$50/month and international roaming charges at \$100/month to prevent bill shock; it allows users to return their cellphones within 15 days and specific usage limits if they are unhappy with the service; users can accept or decline changes to the key terms of a fixed-term contract; fees are also suspended for devices that are being repaired by the wireless provider; and the contracts must be written in plain language so the consumer can better understand the contract terms.
- The Public Interest Disclosure Act, or as it's better known, the Whistleblower Protection Act, came into force on June 1st. The new law gives all public sector employees the confidence and protection they require if they report a wrongdoing. Public sector bodies are required to appoint a designated officer within their organization to investigate and resolve complaints by employees who report violations of provincial or federal laws.
- The Province of Alberta announced that 24 communities around the province will soon have better access to primary health care as the next wave of Family Care Clinics (FCC) are implemented. In our area, a Family Care Clinic will be implemented in Three Hills.
- Alberta's Minimum Wage will increase by 2.1% on September 1st, 2013, representing an increase from \$9.74/hour to \$9.95/hour.
- On Wednesday of this week, we will be hosting the Morrin Grade 6 class and will be educating them about local government.

Attendance of PWS Pratt and PW Report

At 10:20 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt attended the meeting and reviewed his Public Works Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Two dust control spots have now been completed;
- Patching has been completed on the Morrin, Munson and Gartley roads:
- The Airport Hill road had to be closed temporarily on June 2nd, due to flooding;
- Brenda participated with the RCMP, DOT's and SADD program at the Morrin School on May 31st for a driver awareness blitz;
- The road crew have been working on the Munson Transfer Site road and also a washout and culvert on Range Road 21-4;
- He is working on quotes for a roadside mower.

Road Construction on Airport Road

CAO Rawlusyk discussed the road construction repairs proposed for the top of the Drumheller Airport Road. He noted that he had also been requested to consider building an improved access to the Dekeyser property on the north side of the road being repaired. Council reviewed this information and suggested that when the surveyors are out there, that they look at possible alternatives for this access.

Rural Road Study Traffic Counting In connection with the Rural Road Study which we have contracted Stantec Consulting Ltd. to conduct, Council looked at the traffic count locations and traffic volumes which were included in the previous study conducted by Amec Infrastructure Limited. CAO Rawlusyk suggested a few other sites that should be included, and Council members also suggested a few sites to include. We will be conducting traffic counts this summer and training provided by Stantec Consulting Ltd. will be done on June 19th at our office.

Gravel Days

Council discussed holding gravel days for ratepayers in Starland County.

that all hauling is to be done by gravel trucks under contract from Starland County, with no private hauling to be allowed this year.

Departure of PWS Pratt

At 11:20 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt departed from the meeting.

Attendance of Manager Riep & Municipal Services Report At 11:20 a.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Crews had to repair the water lines at Michichi Dam as well as to the Michichi Dam irrigation system and the Starland Recreation Area irrigation system;
- Several water leak investigations have been conducted on the rural water lines;
- Repairs were done to the coin dispensers at the Craigmyle and CLV water truck fill stations;
- Glen attended the Fire Chief's Conference the last week of May in Red Deer;
- He met with Rocky Mountain Phoenix last week to get the truck specifications finalized for the Rumsey Fire Truck. Glen noted that there are some other vehicle options available that may be more relevant to the needs of Starland and the Rumsey Fire Department. He will be working with Rumsey on those options as we proceed with the unit;
- He has now received three quotes for turnout gear for the fire departments;
- The recreation crew have been busy mowing grass in the cemeteries, the recreation areas and hamlets. They are preparing

the grounds for a ball tournament in Rumsey this weekend and the Red Eye Ball tournament coming up later this month at the river ball diamonds:

- They are in the process of constructing new dug-out benches at the Rumsey ball diamonds;
- They are monitoring the McLaren Dam overflow regularly as the outlet continually plugs up with debris causing it to dam up during the spring runoff and any heavy rain. He is looking into a means of clearing the vegetation away from the area to prevent further issues;
- The hydra-deck has now been installed on the new recreation/utilities department F550 truck. However, they encountered a few issues regarding the hydraulic controls for the new deck which are now being addressed.

BluEarth Renewables Inc. Update Meeting CAO Rawlusyk noted that BluEarth Renewables Inc. are hosting an update meeting with stakeholders with regards to the Handhills Wind Power Project, on Wednesday, June 12th, 2013, from 2 - 4 p.m. in the Delia Community Centre. Their objectives for this meeting include reintroducing the BluEarth team and the wind power project; providing an update on the status of the project; and introducing, discussing and improving a potential partnership opportunity.

EMS Dispatch Consolidation Consultation Correspondence was received from the Public Safety Division of Alberta Municipal Affairs with regards to the impacts of EMS Dispatch Consolidation Consultation. As part of the process, they are conducting an online consultation designed to allow municipalities to provide data and comments about how EMS dispatch consolidation has or will affect their communities. This online consultation will close June 21, 2013. Consultation Sessions are also being held, with the Calgary region session that is open to elected officials or CAO's being held on July 8th, 2013 from 3 - 4 pm.

City of Red Deer re: EMS Dispatch Consolidation

In connection with this proposed consolidation process, correspondence was received from the City of Red Deer, with regards to their concerns and questions around the consolidation, noting that they have asked for an immediate suspension of the transition scheduled. A copy of the letter that they sent to the Honourable Fred Horner was also attached, outlining several areas of concern and asking the Government of Alberta to reconsider its decision to consolidate and to cease the transfer until such time as everyone has the information needed to make this critical decision.

Departure of Manager Riep At 12:05 p.m., Manager Riep departed from the meeting.

FCM re: Conference Correspondence

Municipalities (FCM) providing a summary of the value to communities of the FCM's Annual Conference. They also provided a policy statement with regards to rural issues.
