**CAO** Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- The final version of the 2013 Budget has now been completed. The Provincial budget cuts certainly impacted the County's budget as funding had to be allocated to infrastructure that would have been partially funded by grants in the past. The major items included repairs/replacement to two major bridges, as well as replacement of the Craigmyle Lift Station.
- Palliser Regional Municipal Services completed an application for funding under the Regional Collaboration Program. If approved, this funding would be used for flying new aerial orthophotos and GSI integration.
- Ross and Matthew recently attended the Annual Municipal Administration Workshop in Kananaskis.
- Friday, July 19<sup>th</sup> has tentatively been set for the Annual Family Picnic.
- Reid Atwood has shown a willingness to resolve the remaining deficiencies from the office construction, despite the move to

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dissolve their company. The remaining outstanding issue is the roof leak and drywall in the Council room. The roofing company were here last Friday to evaluate this issue and we hope they will soon be able to complete the repairs necessary.

 A Toxic Waste Roundup will be held on Friday, June 7<sup>th</sup>, at the Starland County Public Works yard.

- Ross met with Bob James, who is a Board member with the National Retriever Club of Canada. They are holding a National Championship in Starland County from July 1<sup>st</sup> through to July 6<sup>th</sup>. They previously used the property we recently purchased from Dick Trentham for holding training sessions and he would like to use this property again. This group will be staying in Rowley and will be holding their banquet in Morrin on June 30<sup>th</sup>.
- There was an illegal oil spill reported within the County last week and the incident was reported to Alberta Environment and to the RCMP as well. This oil was in a municipal ditch and Alberta Environment advised that we needed to clean up the mess.
- All of our senior supervisors as well as some others completed training in the management and identification of substance abuse last week. The training focussed on the supervisor's responsibilities to ensure employees are fit for work, as well as how to identify signs of substance abuse. We also held our first session for employees and will be holding at least one more session to complete this orientation.
- Ross noted that we received information on the rate increases for 2013 from the Henry Kroeger Regional Water Services Commission. He is currently working on a new utility bylaw and noted that the County rates will also be increasing to reflect this increase from HKRWS.

2013 Annual Operating & Capital Budgets CAO Rawlusyk reviewed in depth the proposed 2013 Annual Municipal Operating and Capital Budgets for Starland County with Council. The major projects for the year 2013 were highlighted and noted that the total operating budget expenditures are estimated at \$12,830,591.00 and the total capital budget is \$3,885,425.00, plus a transfer to capital reserves of \$760,174.00, and with an overall budgeted surplus of \$3,835.00. CAO Rawlusyk noted that the total assessment within the County increased approximately 3.71%. The largest increase is assessment was from Class 1 - Residential Properties, which increased 35.02%. Non-Residential properties also increased approximately 2.75%, and these properties account for 57.95% of our total assessment. As always, he advised that we work towards a stabilized total tax rate in the County. In 2013, the draft budget presented will see a substantial decrease in Class 1 Residential tax rates, to potentially stabilize their total tax bill. The School tax rates decreased 8.22% for Residential and Farmland properties, and decreased 0.95% for Non-Residential properties. The Non-Collection Allowance increased 10.22% and the Drumheller and District Senior's Foundation tax rate increased 10.86%. The major items in the Capital Budget Estimates besides replacement of various vehicles and equipment, include the replacement of the Craigmyle Sewer Lift Station, two major bridge/culvert replacements, and the CLV Water Expansion and Upgrade Project,

Attendance of PWS Pratt & PW Report

At 11:20 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt attended the meeting and reviewed his Public Works Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Crews have been busy pumping water off the shoulders of the roads in some areas, installing signs and culverts, hydro-vaccing in front of culvert ends in all divisions, removing beaver dams in front of culverts and installing new guard rail east of Morrin.
- The new Volvo L70G loader arrived on May 10<sup>th</sup> and the Strongco reps held an orientation with the mechanics and operators on May 13<sup>th</sup>.
- Crews sorted and organized the culvert shipment that arrived.
- The Safety Barbeque was held on May 10th.
- A cargo securement course was held with all of the crews. The course was put on by Todd Wright and Brenda Gallagher.
- Clean-up was done on an illegal oil spill identified on the east side of Range Road 20-5 and south of Township Road 30-2. Total cost to the County for this clean-up was approximately \$7,900.00.
- Two employees completed Class 1 to Class 3 driver training with Todd Wright. As well, two employees completed their air brake endorsement course.
- Brenda prepared a pre-construction agenda for the 2013 gravel program and on May 27<sup>th</sup>, Al, Brenda, Colleena and Kevin met with the contract gravel truckers at the K & T Pit and went through the orientation and agenda.
- The road crew are working on the Munson Transfer Station Road; did a demolition for Gerry Diegel on an old trailer in Michichi; and completed some ditch work for Jim Nelson in his field.
- Several requests have been received for dust control, which Al hopes to start soon.

Attendance of Manager Riep & Municipal Services Report At 1:50 p.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Load Securement Training was completed at the County shop.
- Gino and Jason are currently attending a Small Water & Waste Water Training Course in Edmonton this week.
- Gino and Glen attended another workshop held in Hanna regarding the development of our water risk planning documents.

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We are required to have a water risk assessment plan for each of our water systems in place by the end of this year.

- Glen met with Theo from MPE to inspect the Craigmyle sewage lift station. This inspection confirmed the need to replace the station at the earliest opportunity.
- The County wide fire restriction has been rescinded since the recent rainfall late last week. We have resumed issuing fire permits once again due to the improved conditions, however, permit holders are reminded of the caution needed due to the fluctuating wind conditions.
- Glen met with Westcan Wireless to review the latest Draft Radio Communications proposal.
- The Recreation Crew has started to get into full swing with the mowing program once again this season. The priority is to work through the cleanup of the cemeteries and then onto the Recreation sites and then onto the hamlets and other county owned properties.
- All campgrounds were busy during the long weekend.
- Glen met with Tyler Jans of Blue Earth Renewables concerning the Handhills wind farm project to discuss their projected time frame for construction. Due to the changes in the overall development, there will need to be a new development permit issued.
- He issued a "Stop Work Order" on a property in Rumsey as the owner commenced construction prior to final approval of their permit. The letter was issued in response to complaints from other residents of Rumsey.
- He attended the Disaster Forum earlier this month in Banff. The scope of the conference centered around Risk and Crisis Communications and how to effectively manage those risks.

Damage Complaint re: S/L Hoover

Correspondence was received from Stephen and Linda Hoover, Delia, Alberta, with regards to flooding caused from damages to the drainage tile over a water line crossing on the SE 1/4 18-33-17-W4M. This damage occurred when the contractor inadvertently plowed through the line. They noted that it has been three crop seasons since this happened and they would like to get the crop and land damages settled. The area affected includes 30 acres of crop land and using the County crop damage payment schedule they determined the following damage payment is due to them:
