CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- He attended the Canadian Solar Industries Association's Solar West Conference in Edmonton on November 1st, 2012;
- He provided an update on the Administration Building construction deficiencies. Many items have been rectified, and the builder is still responsible for correction of all items identified.
- He reviewed the proposed amendments outlined in Bill 7, the Election Accountability Amendment Act. The most significant change is the change of term for local authorities (municipal council and school board) from three years to four years. There are several amendments that relate to how election donations are accounted for, how these are reported, and how any surplus must be disposed of. To date, the Bill has only been given 1st reading.

- He attended a course in Edmonton at MacEwen University on How to Lobby Government Effectively. The course focused on four pillars including information, relationship, pressure and campaigning. He found the session to be quite informative and felt that it certainly will help to form a good plan for lobbying.
- The Alberta Utilities Commission has approved the Eastern Alberta Transmission Line (EATL). This project is estimated at \$1.6 billion, and is a 500-kilovolt direct-current transmission line with associated converter stations and facilities, extending approximately 500 km. from the Gibbons area northeast of Edmonton to near Brooks.
- In preparation of a preliminary design for our Public Works facility, Ross suggested touring a couple of newer facilities and perhaps form a committee of council and staff to work on some recommendations. A growing pot of M.S.I. funding has been earmarked for this new facility.
- Tentative dates for the next Council Planning Retreat is March 13th to 15th, 2013 in Red Deer.
- An announcement from the Federal Government noted that Canadians will be able to save an additional \$500 in their Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA) starting in 2013, raising the annual contribution limit to \$5,500.
- Staff evaluations are ongoing, with a target of completing the Administration staff this week.

PW Report

At 10:30 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt attended the meeting and reviewed his Public Works Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Crews are busy with seasonal work, installing snow fence, preparing units with snow equipment, plowing snow in hamlets and on light oil roads, etc.
- Three public work employees completed their air brake endorsement course;
- Inventory count is now underway;
- The Michichi Fire Truck has now been repaired and is back in service;
- Grader men have been plowing roadways as needed;
- Joe Lowther has returned to work after an extended medical leave;
- He met with Direct Energy over drainage issues southwest of Craigmyle Colony. Approximately 70 meters of ditch is full of blown dirt that needs to be cleaned out;
- He is looking into getting five Whiteline tarp shelters for graders that are left out in the open. This would be easier than starting the graders in cold weather and would be useful for working on them and storing blades, oil, etc.
- He is getting prices on a service / fuel truck for the shop mechanics;
- He is proposing to purchase the Fendt tractor that we rented this summer for mowing. Council suggested that further information be gathered in regards to the actual value of this tractor;
- He suggested that instead of providing the grader men with cell phones, that they utilize their own phones and be provided with a \$50.00 credit in lieu of any County use. This suggestion will be given consideration and discussed further at a later date.

WHEREAS, The Building Canada Plan and a number of important federal-provincial transfer agreements vital to Canada's cities and communities, will expire in March 2014;

WHEREAS, Federal investments over the last few years have helped to slow the decline of our cities and communities, and the Government of Canada has committed to develop a new long-term plan for municipal infrastructure funding in consultation with municipal and provincial/territorial governments;

WHEREAS, A seamless transition from the Building Canada Plan to a new long term plan is necessary to ensure that municipalities can continue planning their capital spending effectively;

WHEREAS, The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) has launched a campaign to ensure the new plan reflects municipal priorities across the country and asks its member municipalities to pass a Council resolution supporting the campaign;

AND WHEREAS, our community has continuing infrastructure needs, such as the continued expansion of rural water systems, upgrading of bridges and bridge size culverts, construction and oiling of roads and construction of municipal buildings like fire halls;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Council endorses the FCM campaign and urges the Minister of Transport, Infrastructure and Communities to work with FCM to ensure the new long-term infrastructure plan meets the core infrastructure needs of cities and communities;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Council urges the Minister of Transport, Infrastructure and Communities to ensure that the new long-term plan is fully in place when existing programs expire in 2014; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution shall be sent

to the Minister of Transport, Infrastructure and Communities, to the Hon. Doug Griffiths, Alberta Minister of Municipal Affairs, to Kevin Sorenson, MP Crowfoot, to the Federation of Canadian Municipalities and to the Alberta Association of Municipal Districts and Counties.

ATCO Electric
re: Project Update

Correspondence was received from ATCO Electric with a project update for October 2012. They noted that their Hanna Region Transmission Development has now been approved by the Alberta Utilities Commission, granting ATCO the permit to construct and the license to operate the facilities. Construction is now underway with a projected completion date of Spring 2013.

Suncor Energy re:

Update

Correspondence was also received from Suncor Energy, providing an update on their proposed Hand Hills Wind Power Project. They have been collecting input and feedback from the community and stakeholders through public open houses and discussion with community members and stakeholders. In addition, they have finalized the details of the wind turbine placement as well as the collector system and road routing. This Project will include 54 wind turbines as well as meteorological towers, an electrical collection system, a substation (adjacent to the proposed ATCO Mother Mountain substation), turbine access roads and temporary construction facilities.

Fire Permit

Mr. Olson noted that he wanted to attend today's meeting to continue to pursue his objection to the fire call from Munson Fire Department that he was billed for. He noted that he feels he was compliant with the fire permit in that he obtained a fire permit; he contacted the Fire Department prior to starting his permitted burn; and he had the proper fire guards in place. Council discussed this issue with Mr. Olson and reviewed Fire Bylaw No. 1042, as well as the Forest and Prairie Protection Act and Regulations. Mr. Olson departed from the meeting at 1:40 p.m.

Municipal Services
Report

Manager Riep reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- AENV was out to do an audit of the CLV water system. The review is completed based on the previous years water operations and due to the ongoing delivery issues with bacteriological sampling operations, noncompliance was found with the monthly reporting requirements.
- The installation of a 6" main isolation valve on the Munson water transmission line feeding Munson and Starland was completed. This valve is necessary to isolate those portions of the line that will be impacted by the road construction south of Munson.
- The water service connection problem at Cranton's meter vault will require excavation to find where the problem is.
- The replacement fire pump for the Michichi fire truck has been installed and the truck returned to service.
- He has met with a number of the fire departments to discuss operations and to gather information for the future development

of the fire services and to identify any problem areas within the fire service. In addition, he is gathering input from the departments on some short and long range goals for each department to assist in developing the objectives and future development of the fire services under the Starland Fire Protection Master Plan.

- He is presently organizing a date for the presentation of the long service pins which the Fire Protection Committee requested in recognition of fire department volunteers.
- A meeting of the Starland Joint Emergency Management is set for January 15th, 2013, here at the County Office.
- He has tentatively set January 10th, 2013 for a meeting of the Starland Disaster Committee.
