- Finished up gravelling;

- Did inventory on signs, culverts, couplers and fencing materials;
- Tom, Bill and Kevin have been doing CVIPs;
- Buck has been busy getting the new light duty units ready;
- The road crew has finished up for the year and the remaining staff were let go on November 21st;
- Brenda Gallagher has been working on permits and she shut down and put a curfew on the county roads when it was warmer and melting;
- Colleena is finishing up gravel tickets, the gravel map and will be helping with inventory;
- Al has taken GPS training and is working on purchase orders and invoices.

Services Report

At 11:05 a.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- The Utilities crew has been helping out with the CLV upgrade as well as THM and Lead Sampling as well as Cemetery Work;
- Fire permits have been in high demand since the snow has fallen;
- New turnout gear for the fire departments has been completed with most of the gear delivered or near completion;
- Chinook Pipelines has brought a couple of directional drills onsite and is working at some of the areas that could not be completed with the plow unit;
- He attended the AEMA Stakeholder Summit meetings in Calgary earlier this month and is planning on setting up a regional disaster meeting for December 19th;
- The MPC has approved the construction of a commercial Bulk Fuel Depot located north east of Rumsey;
- The GPS unit for information and data collection within the cemeteries has arrived and training on the device was received;
- Construction of the Craigmyle Lift Station has begun and should be completed in the New Year. The land transfer of the Irwin property appears to have been completed as the cheques were cashed. He is arranging to get the keys to the site so that demolition can begin. Three phase power to the property is being routed along the north boundary of our property.

Treated Water
Reservoir Study

CAO Rawlusyk reviewed with Council the results of a study produced by MPE outlining the treated water storage needs for Starland County and it's villages and hamlets. The summary outlined a probable cost of \$13,600,000 to address all capacity issues with the highest priorities being storage in Morrin, Munson and Delia.

CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Ross provided an update on the Provincial Government's plan to revise the Local Authorities Pension Plan and is drafting a number of comments to be submitted to the Minister;

- As an update to the New Building repairs Peddie Roofing has identified the problem that has led to leaks in the council room and reception area and it should be fixed completely by the spring;
- A Joint safety meeting with the Town of Drumheller has been schedule for Friday, November 29th starting at 12:30 p.m.;
- A review of the impact of the U.S. COOL Legislation was presented with the retaliatory measures now authorised by the WTO on behalf of Canada. Tariff's will now be implemented on 38 American food items;
- The new CETA agreement with the European Union will result in new tendering requirements for Canadian governments purchasing. The thresholds are quite high and as of yet the process has not been identified for advertising;
- Wildrose Assessment Services noted that they have extra time this winter and are offering to accelerate the reviews of the improvements for farmland and residential properties;
- Ross travelled to Coutts with Lloyd Hodge to pick up a gazebo for the Delia Cemetery on November 20th.
