CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- AESO advised that an information update has been submitted for the Nexen Hand Hills Wind Energy Connection. Joss Wind Power Inc. has requested transmission system access for its proposed Joss Hand Hills Wind Power Facility by Delia. AESO is processing this request and intend to apply to the Alberta Utilities Commission for an approval for this project in the Fall of 2012.
- We received an invitation from the Canadian Solar Industries Association (CanSIA) to attend a new Western Canadian solar energy industry's annual conference and showcase in Edmonton.
- Starland County will be hosting an event in Delia on November 1st on solar development, focusing on farm scale solar projects.
- An updated list of deficiencies was forwarded to Reed Atwood and Sherri Turpin requesting their attention to these items.
- The majority of taxes were collected at the end of September. Our tax collection rate remained relatively stable, with 96.81% of the total taxes outstanding, now being collected.
- Roadata Services Ltd. and Stantec Consulting have been working together on the mapping requirements for our TRAVIS permitting system setup. The transition went well and the TRAVIS system is scheduled to go live today (October 10th).
- The Road Tour is scheduled for Monday, October 15th commencing at 8:00 a.m.
- The Town of Drumheller is celebrating their 100th Anniversary next year. The Chamber of Commerce would like to honour rural residents that have farmed in the area for 100 years as well. They are also talking about a *Take a Farmer to Lunch* function that will run through the year.
- Gravel crushing at the Scollard Pit is scheduled to start in a week or so.

Attendance of PWS Pratt and PW Report

At 10:20 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt attended the meeting and reviewed his Public Works report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- The Public Works Crew finished and filled in the gas/power line trench in the yard for the new sand shed;
- The roadside mowing is approximately 75% complete;
- · Equipment is now being prepared for winter and snowplowing;
- The Road Crew is working on the Munson Transfer Station Road and will soon be ready to gravel the first section from the light oil road south to the rail road tracks in case the weather turns bad.
- 107 miles have been completed of the 2012 Gravel Program, as well as 95 miles of add-ons;
- In Division 5 there were approximately 240 tractor/trailer loads of manure hauled on Twp. Rd. 33-0 over the weekend which caused extensive damage to the road;
- They were only able to get 21,000 litres of MG 30, which was placed on two intersections (4 ways) on the Handhill Haul Road;
- The final inspection was done on BF 13425.

Finning Canada re: Purchase of Motor Grader

CAO Rawlusyk reviewed information received from Finning Canada with regards to the preliminary sales order for the rental conversion of the 2011 Cat 160M motor grader that the County has had on rent since May 2012. Finning is offering to apply 100% of the rental payments made to the purchase of this unit, as well as provide a snow wing and the balance of the Full-Machine, FOB warranty which expires on December 3, 2013, for a purchase price of \$393,000.00 less the rental paid, for a total of \$324,876.17 plus GST.

C12-186 Authorization to **Purchase Cat** 160M Motor Grader

that Starland County purchase the 2011 Cat 160M Motor Grader from Finning Canada that we have been renting since May 2012; and that after the rental payments are applied to the principal value of the equipment, a purchase price of \$324,876.17 plus GST be paid for this unit.

Survey Issue on Twp. Rd. 31-0

CAO Rawlusyk reviewed an issue with regards to the proposed subdivision of the SW 1/4 3-31-16-W4M. Upon surveying this area for the proposed subdivision, the surveyor discovered that the Township Road 31-0, between Range Road 16-2 and Range Road 16-4 is not a 66 ft. right-of-way and the road boundary is directly on the edge of the existing roadway, with no allowance for the ditch right-of-way. He recommended that we have our surveyor, New West Geomatics, re-survey this portion of roadway, and provide information for the purchase of the existing right-of-way required to make this a 66 foot right-of-way consistently along this east/west roadway.

C12-187 Authorization to Survey & Correct Road Plan on Twp. Rd. 31-0

that Starland County contract New West Geomatics to survey the portion of Township Road 31-0, between Range Road 16-2 and Range Road 16-4, to determine the extent of right-of-way required to be purchased to have a complete 66 foot right-of-way on this roadway; and following the completion of this survey, the County purchase the additional right-of-way required.

Field Access re: SE 1/4 32-29-19-4

CAO Rawlusyk reviewed the road acquisition options available to provide field access to the S.E. 1/4 32-29-19-W4M with Council. Council reviewed these options and determined that the best option available would involve the purchase of 0.754 acres, including a turn-around area, as this would be considered a dead-end roadway.

Attendance of RCMP

At 11:10 a.m., Art Hopkins, S/Sgt. NCO from the Drumheller Detachment RCMP, attended the meeting to discuss the *Occurrence Stats for All Violations* as well as other issues of interest. Mr. Hopkins departed from the meeting at 12:10 p.m.

Attendance of Manager Riep & Municipal Services Report At 1:55 p.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- · Michichi Fire Truck repairs are ongoing;
- There are a few items to address concerning the Munson Transfer Station Road. The old water line that was abandoned earlier is now lying on top of the ground due to the new road profile. This line may still need to be salvaged due to other areas within the project where the line will be in conflict. In addition, we need to insure the cover is adequate on the existing live waterline that was lowered earlier, as nearly four meters of the hill was removed in that portion of the road improvement. Also several valves located in fill areas will require extensions or removal of the valves and a large section of the line will require replacement due to the cuts in the road profile. The Transfer Station Site itself has also been dramatically affected by the road construction, changing the access locations and relocating the power supply line along with the building and movable bins;
- A Stop Work Order was issued on a sand excavation development as no permits were obtained;
- He attended the Alberta Development Officers Conference in Drumheller, from September 24th to 26th, 2012;
- Fire Permits are being issued once again since the recent moisture in the area;
- A Fire Protection Committee Meeting will be held Thursday, October 25th, 2012 at the Starland County Administration Office commencing at 7:00 p.m.

Badlands Ambulance Services Society re: Ambulance Services Council reviewed a copy of the Badlands Ambulance Services Society Special Board of Director's Meeting held on October 4th, 2012. This meeting was held to discuss the business of continuing or divesting this ambulance service. A motion was carried unanimously that Badlands Ambulance Services Society divest and turn the service over to the Alberta Health Services to leave to their decision to hand the service over to other "for profit" or "non-profit" organizations or to be direct delivery under their services. In addition, a press release in this regard was distributed to the newspapers and radio stations in the affected areas.
