### CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Starland County's Internal Safety Audit is now complete, with an overall score of 88%. While it identifies areas that we do well in, it also notes areas needing improvement. Some of these areas include Hazard Identification and Assessment, job descriptions for seasonal job positions and the formal inspection process.
- Nomination Day was Monday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2013 and CAO Rawlusk noted that we will have elections in three divisions. In Divisions 1 and 3, incumbents Murray Marshall and Bob Sargent were acclaimed and will fill these positions for the next four years.
- He recently attended the ARMAA Conference in Lethbridge from September 4<sup>th</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup>.
- The CLV Rural Water Expansion Project is on hold, pending the completion of harvest in that area. CAO Rawlusk noted that we might have some additional funding available on these installations and he is looking to add additional users to utilize these funds. MPE is costing out an additional 7 installations which will hopefully be able to be included within this project.
- In addition, over the course of the next month, Ross will also be advertising for any additional farms or residences that want access to regional water. It is his intention that the supply lines to these users will be added to the infrastructure application with the additional water storage that is needed.

- Ross noted that the Province recently released a document called "Charting a New Course - A Vision for Public Sector Pension Reform". They are calling for consultation on the proposed changes to the public sector pension plan. Ross noted that these proposed changes will have a major impact on the pension plan and subsequently the employees who are a part of this plan. These changes will be carefully reviewed and comments on same will be prepared for further consideration.
- Our staff were involved with the Tour of Alberta and helped out with traffic control. It went off without incident and was well publicized on T.V.
- On September 21<sup>st</sup>, the first tree planting project with the Carbon Farmer Inc. was carried out on approximately 2 acres of the County's land adjacent to the Ducks Unlimited property. The plan is that the rest of the site will be planted early in the spring after the snow melt.
- The Bleriot Ferry turns 100 years old this year and plans are underway for an article in the newspaper to commemorate the 100 years of service the ferry has provided.
- The Town of Drumheller is holding an official opening of their new Town Administration Office on Thursday, October 3<sup>rd</sup>, at 1:15 p.m.
- Welcome to Cayla Martin who has joined our staff as the Family Resource Worker for the Delia School.
- Bridgemen Services submitted a tendered price of \$215,625.00 to carry out bridge structure repairs on four bridge files. We also pre-tendered repairs for 2014 totalling \$263,900.00 for another 9 bridge structures. Stantec are currently tendering the culvert replacement for Bridge File 7701.
- Stantec advised that the liner will not need replacing in Bridge File 70535 (Russell slide). The funding budgeted for the liner can now be used to complete the extension required on this culvert. Stantec will proceed with the tender and design of the extension.

At 9:45 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt attended the meeting and reviewed his Public Works Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Regular maintenance is ongoing with installation of culverts, building approaches, hauling gravel to repair back roads, roadside mowing, hamlet clean-up days, etc.
- Crews started on the Craigmyle playground removing old equipment and landscaping.
- 1200 miles of roadside mowing has been completed.
- 129 miles of the 2013 gravel program has been completed as well as 82 miles of add-ons. The K & T Pit gravel supply will soon be depleted.
- The Public Works crew will be building an approach and new road into the MixCor Pit.

Report

At 11:05 a.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- The summer crew is winding down for the year as they finish cleaning up a few items. They are currently travelling the entire water pipeline infrastructure to clean up the grass and weeds around all the valve structures, crossing and hydrant locations.
- They are working on installing the new irrigation inlet and pumping structure at Michichi Dam that will allow us to safely pump water for irrigation operations and easy access to the pumping equipment.
- We are still on high fire alert with fire restrictions in place for all of Starland County.
- Chinook Pipelines is scheduled to commence moving equipment and materials onsite later this week. Their plan is to start installing all the underground piping as soon as possible and then complete the tie-ins and other valve installations.
- As to the solar portion of the CLV project, Rick Dunsmore is ready to move in some of his equipment that will be going into the CLV Truckfill Station.
- They repaired a waterline failure for Morning Glory Water Co-op last week. The repair was greatly hindered by the location of the Bears paw Petroleum Oil line situated on top of the water line. The excavation required an extensive amount of hydrovac work to safely locate and expose the lines for the repair work to be completed.
- Preparations for the tender and project design for the Craigmyle lift station continues. Atco is providing a quote on a new 3-phase service to the site from the existing single phase we currently have. Favourable discussions have been held with Gary Irwin with regards to purchasing part or all of his parcel located along the north-east side of Craigmyle, which would allow for the placement of the new lift station.
- The testing of the emergency backup power equipment in the Administration Office determined that we will require further modifications to our electrical supply connections. With some minor modifications to our connections inside the building, it should be able to be powered entirely by a single generator using our existing equipment.
