### CAO Report

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed his CAO Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- On September 24<sup>th</sup>, 2012, he attended a Community Action on Climate Change Workshop in Edmonton.
- Council is invited to attend the Bronze Award Ceremony for the Duke of Edinburgh's Award on October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2012 at 7:00 p.m. at the Badlands Community Facility.
- A new five-year Growing-Forward Policy Framework was approved in principle by Agriculture Ministers from across Canada. Program changes will allow for an increased focus on programs that enhance research and innovation, competitiveness and market development.
- On September 21<sup>st</sup>, 2012, Ross attended a meeting in Nisku of all rural employers that are involved in the Community Peace Officer Program. Bill Meade, the Assistant Deputy Minister with the Public Security Division of Alberta Justice and Solicitor General, as well as Matthew Barker, Director of Law Enforcement Standards were both in attendance. Topics discussed included CPIC, Employer Investigation, Communication System, Amalgamation of Government Services, Training, Foothills Tragedy, Radio System and the upcoming review of the CPO

program later this fall.

- Phone Experts will be installing a cell phone booster and antenna in the office as soon as possible.
- A summary of the survey conducted by Wheatland County on cemeteries was provided to Council.
- Congratulations to Diana Rowe who was recently elected by her peers to the FCSSAA Provincial Board.
- The Canadian Badlands Foundation invited Ross to participate into the development of their Strategic Plan for 2012 - 2015 at a one day session on October 19<sup>th</sup> at the Badlands Community Facility in Drumheller.
- Diana Rowe recently updated the Family Resource Worker Program Policy and Procedure Handbook and a draft of this document with the proposed changes was reviewed together with Cam McKeage, Chief Deputy Superintendent with Prairie Land School Division.

PW Report

At 10:15 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt attended the meeting and reviewed his Public Works Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- Hamlet clean-up days are now complete;
- Completed installation of the GPS address signs;
- Four Rowley directional signs were installed;
- A pad was built at the Michichi Transfer Site for the Ag Service Board;
- Clean-up was needed after the wind storm on Monday, September 10<sup>th</sup>, 2012;
- Bridge work, new approaches built, regular maintenance and repair issues, etc.;
- The road crew have started on the Munson Transfer Station Road;
- Brenda has been issuing unsightly notices as well as doing road inspections, monitoring our contract truckers and Carillion truckers. Several complaints have been received about the Carillion truckers speeding, running stop signs and not slowing down when meeting people on the road;
- Strongco are bringing out a Volvo grader and loader to demo the first week of October;
- "No Dumping" signs will be installed in Craigmyle along Railway Avenue, Morrin River Campground and also the gravel pits, noting that fines will be issued under Starland County Bylaw #1091;
- Fuel was stolen from all the road crew units once again last week. Al suggested that Council might want to offer a reward to anyone who can offer information regarding the theft, perhaps joining forces with some of the oil and gas companies who have also experienced many thefts lately.

CAO Rawlusyk advised Council that although we were not able to obtain an Agreement for Acquisition of Land from the landowner on the SE 9-30-20-W4M for Road Construction Project RC.11004, the landowner did agree to sign an Agreement for Backsloping and Earthborrow. As this is a variation of Council's policy to acquire extra roadway area to meet a 99 foot right-of-way, a motion of Council to accept same is required.

Munson Transfer Station Site Access Road

CAO Rawlusyk also discussed the access road into the Munson Transfer Station Site. Road Foreman Stan Hampton has suggested that the access proposed be changed slightly to allow for better access in and out of this site. Council agreed that the revised access alignment would better serve the people utilizing it.

Ducks Unlimited Beaverpond Project

Chief Administrative Officer Ross Rawlusyk reviewed the Ducks Unlimited Beaverpond Project on the NW 1/4 21-31-19-W4M with Council. The County has been working on repairing the spillway and Ducks Unlimited are now prepared to transfer their ownership of this area to Starland County. In addition, Mr. Trentham, the adjacent landowner, has proposed to sell the surrounding area around the beaverpond to the County, so as to provide the County with better access to this area. The additional area would need to be subdivided and would be approximately 14.23 ha. (35.16 ac.).

At 10:20 a.m., Public Works Supervisor Pratt departed from the meeting.

Attendance of Manager Riep & Municipal Services Report

At 10:20 a.m., Manager Riep attended the meeting and reviewed his Municipal Services Report with Council. Highlights of his report included the following:

- The recreation sites are winding down for the year. The grounds are normally accessible and open for the public to the end of October, restricting some access to some facilities mostly due to the lack of use and supervision;
- Additional irrigation lines are being installed at Michichi Dam;
- He is investigating two high water usage complaints along the Starland Regional Water Authority water line;
- There is a pending Subdivision and Development Appeal Board hearing for a recent development application for a residential home;
- The rear mounted fire pump was damaged beyond repair on the Michichi fire truck. A new portable pump has been ordered, however, the old Craigmyle truck will be used by Michichi in the interim;
- Glen recommended that a fire restriction be placed on any outstanding fire permits in Starland County, as well as no new applications being approved, due to the extreme dry conditions within the County;
- He issued a letter of clarification to all fire members and municipal councils regarding some issues brought forth concerning non-approved inspections being carried out within the Starland Fire Protection Area;
- He would like to schedule a Fire Protection Committee meeting for October 18<sup>th</sup> or 25<sup>th</sup>, 2012. In addition to other agenda items,

a new agreement needs to be established to replace the last agreement which has expired.

The Government of Alberta forwarded a News Release asking Albertans to help set the boundaries for spending, saving and funding infrastructure through a public consultation called Dollars and Sense. A series of panel discussions are scheduled for September, as well as public sessions across the province in October. Online submissions will be accepted until October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2012.

Report Card

Various correspondence was received with regards to the Canadian Infrastructure Report Card. The Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) has partnered with three industry organizations to develop the first ever Canadian Infrastructure Report Card, which was created to establish a process for assessing the health of Canada's infrastructure and to inform Canadians, policymakers and other stakeholders about issues and trends. The first edition of the Report Card measured the condition of municipal roads, drinking water, wastewater and storm water systems. Results of the survey conducted showed that storm water infrastructure was very good, drinking water and wastewater infrastructure was good, and municipal roads ranked between fair and very poor.

Correspondence was received from Mylène Freeman, MP, to inform Council of a private members motion (M-400) that she recently tabled in the House of Commons. She noted that she believes M-400 will be of great, practical benefit and is in regards to the possibility of establishing one or more financial support programs that would bring up to standard the septic systems of homes not connected to a sanitation system, in an effort to ensure urban/rural balance, lake protection, water quality and public health. She is asking that we support this Motion by passing it as a municipal resolution in our council, and also forwarded a petition in this regard. CAO Rowlusyk will forward a letter in support of Motion M-400 to our local MP Kevin Sorenson.

The Canadian Badlands Tourism Leadership Symposium is to be held on October 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>, 2012 at Trochu/Three Hills, Alberta.

New Regulatory Requirements for Surface Development in Proximity to Abandoned Well Sites

CAO Rawlusk reviewed Information Bulletin Number 05/12 received from Alberta Municipal Affairs. This bulletin is in regards to *Advisory Land Use Planning Notes on New Regulatory Requirements for Surface Development in Proximity to Abandoned Wells*. Effective November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2012 it will be the responsibility of the developer or landowner of the proposed subdivision and/or development to take measures to identify any abandoned wells within that property and to apply the required setback as set out in the ERCB directive. Also, it is the responsibility of the municipality, as part of the subdivision and development application process, to ensure that the proponent of the subdivision or development has taken these measures and has applied the required setback. These efforts will ensure that abandoned wells are appropriately identified and suitable setbacks are incorporated in planning, development and construction decisions.

Ed Caswell re: Access Issue

CAO Rawlusk updated Council on an access issue within the S.E. 1/4 32-29-19-W4M. He noted that we had previously advised the landowner that the County has no plans to build an access on the existing road allowance and the municipality really has no obligation to provide a solution to the access issue. Irrespective of this, as a proposed long term solution, CAO Rawlusk recommended offering to purchase approximately 0.40 acres (0.16 ha.) from the landowner so a short segment of road access could be constructed. He reviewed the proposed location of the access with Council. He noted that the adjacent road is simply a back trail, it is not gravelled or upgraded, and the proposed short access would be developed to the same standard. He added that the landowner has not generally accepted this alternative, but as an attempt to resolve the access issue, a final formal offer could be forwarded to the landowner.


