

**BYLAW NO. 2013
OF STARLAND COUNTY
IN THE PROVINCE OF ALBERTA, CANADA**

Being a Bylaw of the Council of Starland County, in the Province of Alberta, to establish an alternative method for advertising statutory notices.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 606 of the Municipal Government Act, a Council must give notice of certain bylaws, resolutions, meetings, public hearings or other things by advertising in a newspaper or other publication circulating in the area, mailing or delivering a notice to every residence in the affected area or by another method provided for in a bylaw under section 606.1 of the Municipal Government Act;

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to section 606.1(1) of the Municipal Government Act, a Council may, by bylaw, provide for one or more methods, which may include electronic means, for advertising proposed bylaws, resolutions, meetings, public hearings and other things referred to in section 606 of the Municipal Government Act.

AND WHEREAS, Council is satisfied that the advertising method set out in this bylaw is likely to bring matters advertised by that method to the attention of substantially all residents in the area to which the bylaw, resolution or other thing relates or in which the meeting or hearing is to be held;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of Starland County, in the Province of Alberta, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

PART 1: INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This bylaw shall be referred to as the Advertisement Bylaw.
- 1.2 Any notice required to be advertised under section 606 of the Municipal Government Act of a bylaw, resolution, meeting, public hearing or other thing may be given, in accordance with the timelines prescribed in section 606 the following applicable methods:
 - a. By posting the notice in the Drumheller Mail newspaper; or
 - b. Electronically by posting a notice prominently on Starland County's website: www.starlandcounty.com or other electronic means as determined by the Chief Administrative Officer.

PART 2: REPEAL OF BYLAW

- 2.1 Any bylaw or clause regarding advertising is hereby repealed, and this Bylaw comes into force and effect when it has received third reading and has been duly signed.

PART 3: SEVERABILITY

- 3.1 Every provision of this Bylaw is independent of all other provisions and;

- 3.2 If any provision of this Bylaw is declared invalid for any reason by a Court of competent jurisdiction, all other provisions of this Bylaw shall remain valid and enforceable.
- 3.3 This Bylaw shall come into force and effect when it has received third reading and has been duly signed
